



Race Value Graph






Leading Causes of Death – Mortality 2005 - 2009



Health Action Teams 2009-2012



The Healthy Living team's main focus is Physical Activity & Nutrition. Secondary outcome goals - Help prevent or better manage chronic and preventable diseases such as Cancer, Asthma, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases.

Substance Abuse The Substance Abuse team addresses alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs focusing on education and resources through prevention and treatment.

Mental Health The Mental Health team focuses on providing education, resources and breaking the stigma that can accompany Mental Health concerns.

- 9 Healthy Tips & Opps sent monthly via e-mail to database reaching over 3500 people







Prevalence of Obesity in Children Ages 5-11 Years







Unintentional & Undetermined intent poisoning mortality rates/100,000 population Western NC Counties - 2008




