PROGRAMS AND SERVICES



ADULT SERVICES

Adult Day Care/Day Health: Provides organized program-

ming and activities during the day to support adults' personal

independence. State certified program for individualized care for adults with disabilities and respite for their caregivers.

Adult Care Home Services: Licenses and monitors all county Adult Care Homes to ensure compliance with licensing standards. Investigates complaints as needed and develops corrective action plans to support quality care of residents.

<u>Adult Placement Services:</u> Assistance to aged or adults with disabilities and their families in finding suitable adult care home or nursing facility placement.

Adult Protective Services: Services provided to correct or prevent further abuse, neglect, and/or exploitation to adults with disabilities.

CAP/DA: Community Alternative Program for Disabled Adults who are Medicaid-eligible and qualify for nursing home level of care. Program utilizes Medicaid benefits to ensure that a person can remain safely in their home and receive the services needed to avoid institutional care.

Guardianship: Evaluates individual situations to determine if a person with disabilities is in need of an appropriate guardian to ensure their needs are met and they are safe from abuse, neglect, and/or exploitation. Provides all necessary services as disinterested public guardian where appointed by the Clerk of Court under General Statute 35A.

In-Home Aide Services: Provides assistance with basic home management tasks by contract.

<u>Meals on Wheels:</u> Preparation and delivery of nutritious meals to clients' homes to prevent institutionalization or malnutrition.

Representative Payee Services: When appointed as representative payee, the agency manages income to meet clients' needs when the client has been determined unable to manage financial benefits.

<u>SA In-Home Program:</u> Provides an alternative to placement in an adult care home for Medicaid eligible individuals who can live at home safely with additional support services.

<u>Services for the Blind:</u> Provides a variety of services for people who are visually impaired or blind.

CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

<u>Adoption:</u> A permanent plan for children when they cannot return to their parents.

<u>Child Foster Care:</u> Provides temporary care for children who must be separated from parents/families unable to provide adequate care or protection.

<u>Child Protective Services:</u> Provides a legally mandated assistance aimed at strengthening family life by supporting and improving parental/caretaker abilities while assuring the safety of children.

<u>CPS In-Home Services:</u> Develops plans with parents and families to ensure that children can be protected and adequately cared for in their homes and avoid out-of-home placement. Case Plans are designed and monitored to address the ongoing well-being of children to prevent maltreatment.

<u>Foster Home Licensing:</u> Recruitment and assessment of families interested in fostering. Provides training and ongoing compliance with state standards.

Independent Living/LINKS: Assists youth in foster care in planning for adulthood through the development of independent living plans and skills.

ECONOMIC AND FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

Food

and Nutrition Services: Federal food assistance program that provides low income families the food they need for a nutritionally adequate diet.

<u>Adult Medicaid</u>: Medical assistance for qualifying individuals who are 65 or older, blind, disabled and have income/resources to meet the eligibility requirements.

<u>Family and Children's Medicaid</u>: A broad range of medical assistance programs for qualifying families and children who cannot afford health care costs, including medical assistance for pregnant women.

<u>Special Assistance</u>: Provides financial assistance for cost of care to people 18 years or older in adult care facilities, group homes or area-operated mental health homes. Medicaid benefits are included.

<u>Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP):</u>
Provides a one-time vendor payment to assist qualifying households with heating expenses.

<u>Crisis Intervention Program (CIP):</u> Provides funding to prevent or alleviate a crisis due to heating or cooling needs. Payments are made directly to service providers.

Work First Family Assistance: Helps parents support themselves and their families by providing short-term training and other services to increase the chances of employment.

<u>Program Integrity:</u> maintains the integrity of public assistance programs by deterring, investigating, and prosecuting fraud.

<u>Child Support Services:</u> Provides location of noncustodial parents, establishment of paternity, establishment of support obligations, monitoring collection of payments and enforcement of support obligations.
